New Resources!

Kanopy Streaming Videos offers close to 6,000 streaming videos on all topics, including the entire Media Education Foundation catalog (*Killing Us Softly 4*, *Tough Guise 2*, and more) and films from the California Newsreel. You can watch videos online, create clips, and embed them into your course pages.

PhilPapers: Philosophical Research Online is a comprehensive index and open access archive of philosophy books and articles. It offers unique features such as email alerts, reading lists, and discussion forums.

Statista allows you to download statistical charts and infographics as PowerPoint slides, Excel files, image files and PDFs, all under a Creative Commons license so you can use and publish these charts in your work.

Over the summer we purchased new titles for the **juvenile collection**, new **graphic novels**, and more key literary titles for the **American literature collection**.

A new collection of books and research materials, the **Jack London in Context Collection**, reflects London's personal and literary connections. This collection was donated to the Library by Palmer Andrews in 2013.

We'll be hosting another series of **Design Your Library** events beginning September 4. These events use brainstorming and usability activities to elicit student feedback as we continue to improve the Library space, website, and services. Banned Books Week is September 21-27, 2014, and this year we'll be focusing on censorship in comics and graphic novels. We'll be hosting a panel discussion and a comic writing workshop to engage students and teach them about how and why ideas and creative expression have been censored throughout history.

The University Library Art Gallery kicks off the 2014/2015 year with the exhibit **CLOAK: Iterations of a Draped Figure**, recent work by Frank Ryan. Ryan received his BFA from SSU and MFA from UCLA. The works in this exhibit were inspired during Ryan's time at Chalk Hill Artist Residency. Ryan will give a gallery talk on **October 30**, followed by a closing reception.

New Services!

Create your personal bookshelf of scholarly journals with **Browzine**, a new app provided by the University Library where you can subscribe to your favorite journals and have new issues automatically sent to your device. Visit the Library website for more information or download the app from the Apple App Store, the Amazon App Store, or Google Play.

There are **new scanning options** in the Library. All of the new photocopiers can also be used as scanners free of charge. We also have a new microfilm scanner. Just bring a USB drive and follow the instructions provided at each machine.
